A Cry for Help



Recently I read the testimony of a man who said that during his intimate prayer time, he sensed the Holy Spirit was weeping. When he asked the Spirit, "Why do you weep?" the man himself began to weep. It wasn't just tears, but an awful feeling of grief that accompanied them. This grief and these tears lasted for three weeks and it was a glimpse of the sadness and pain the Holy Spirit must endure as He watches the souls He loves so much, being lost every day.

Because of this experience, this man was able to realise the urgency and importance of praying for conversions and evangelising people who have not yet come to the Lord. That experience gave him a passion for souls that has never diminished or departed.

Have you ever asked yourself, "Why must I evangelise?" We all know we are called to evangelise by virtue of our baptism, but why? The answer is **salvation**. It's the reason Jesus came to this earth, it's the theme of the Bible, it's the

mission of the church, it's the reason the disciples received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, and it's the reason why God has equipped us with all the gifts of the Spirit. The reason is **salvation** of the



souls our Lord loves so much, who are being lost every day.

There are people in the School of Evangelisation who have given their lives for the cause of evangelisation - just like Jesus did. I don't mean literally, but these people die to themselves and pick up their cross every day and follow Jesus. Day after day, these people enter the

front lines of the battle against Satan and his demons. Day after day, they put themselves and their loved ones at risk to do the work the Lord has called them to do. Day after day, they endure persecution and spiritual attack.

These are usually things that are kept quiet, things we don't like to talk about because they're classed as being negative. But I'm going to be completely honest and up front here, because this needs to be spoken about and not kept hidden—because to keep it hidden only assists Satan to do his work.

The people in the SOE need urgent help. There are wondrous things beginning to happen here. The SOE is penetrating the parishes of Australia, to bring the Word of God, not only to the already converted, but to the every day parishioners, whose souls are starving for knowledge, information and infilling of the Spirit. The SOE is bringing the Word to these people in a dynamic and powerful way.

Formation of Disciples Course—Canberra SOE

Course on 18-23rd April, 2005, with eight participants, mostly young people. The members of the team presenting this course were: Les Roberts, Canberra co-ordinator,

Ann Clementine, Lucy & Eddie Grasso, Col Robens (Sydney SOE) and Deidre Herring (Wollongong SOE). The venue was St Christopher’s Cathedral, Manuka, Parish Centre, with the facility of the crypt under the Cathedral for Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a sacred space set aside for prayer, reflection, intercession and adoration.

The course was part of the eight week Mission Formation School put on by the Global Holy Spirit with Mission Ministries, founded by Brian Welsh, with the blessing and support of the Archbishop of Canberra and Goulburn, Rev Francis Carroll.

The participants who attended came from Melbourne, Sydney, Armidale and Canberra - a wide area, considering the small number of participants.

All commented that the

course was a fresh challenge for them to grow in discipleship, to be creative, to deepen their personal relationship with Jesus, and to understand his method of teaching and forming his disciples. It was a time of deep encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist and a source of inner healing.

Some weeks after the course, two of the participants, together with Brian Welsh and Les Roberts, proceeded to the International Missionary outreach in England and Ireland to put into practice their new found formation in discipleship and evangelisation.

teners to the speakers. Instead we became actively involved through various dynamics set into the program. It was through participation in these dynamics that I felt touched in body, soul, mind and spirit. The realities of life in relation to the teachings of Jesus and His own life on earth were beautifully explored.

The Eucharist—the Real Presence of Jesus, is an awesome gift to us. The words of consecration used by the priest in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass hold a deeper meaning to me in relation to my own life. My prayer life has been enriched through my closer relationship with the Holy Spirit and the Scriptures. I believe that I have been richly blessed. Praise the Lord !!!!

- ◆ Call these people together for a limited time to focus on a particular outreach eg Catholics Returning Home or Alpha or a men's breakfast

or a New Life course.

- ◆ As the opportunity presents itself follow this up with formation in discipleship where people can be invited to a deeper level of commitment to evangelisation.

Many thanks to Bishop Joe for his encouragement and hospitality in opening his home to us for the meeting. Also to Denise Ilott for her hospitality in accommodating the visitors and organizing a lovely social evening together.

Mothers Prayers—United in Prayer we save our children

Are you concerned about your children? Since the last article about Mothers Prayers was published in The Witness, many people have formed new groups and there have been some wonderful answers to prayer. God is honouring His promise "Ask and you shall receive."

In January I came to Melbourne and attended the Charismatic Conference. While at the conference I received a phone call from a very concerned mum in Brisbane whose sixteen year old daughter was under pressure to terminate her pregnancy. The mother writes:

Through God's Grace and guidance my daughter was given the strength, wisdom and courage to go forward with her pregnancy. My daughter has always known that abortion is an abhorrent act and upon learning of her pregnancy I felt that this would not be an issue for her. Even so I sensed and understood her despair, fear and confusion and wanted to protect her from anyone who might influence her in the wrong way.

My husband felt that she was too young and should terminate the pregnancy. I took her to the school counsellor and prayed silently while the options were explained to her. Arriving home, I found the Mothers Prayers newsletter and rang Rosa on her mobile. Rosa said that she would get prayer support for us from the people at the conference.

From this time forward it became apparent that God was

working in every area of our lives. The school continues to support our daughter. The relationship between my daughter and her father has grown and he has offered her his continued support (this is such a miracle) and I find her asking for his advice. I don't know how God's plan works but I do know that God will continue to guide us and that my daughter, through her daily prayer and bible reading cannot go wrong.

I wish to thank Mothers Prayers, Rosa and all the women who sent their prayer support through signing of a beautiful card. God bless you all, Helen.

Another mum, Jacquie, writes:

My daughter lost custody of her two children after a nasty custody battle. Her ex-husband beat her and abused her badly. She had a car accident and was in a lot of pain and on anti-depressants. Since I began attending Mothers Prayers she is no longer on anti-depressants and has regained access to her children. Things are going so much better for her. Thank God.

A few weeks ago she purchased a Praise and Worship CD. She enjoyed this CD so much that she wanted to play it in the car but did not have a CD player in the car. She said to God, "If you want me to play this CD in the car you will have to provide me with a player." A few days later as she was stopped at the lights, a man pulled up beside her, jumped out of the car, knocked on her window and offered her a CD player explaining that his

CD player had been stolen and the insurance had given him this one but it did not fit his car. When she asked how much he wanted he said, "Nothing it's yours," and drove off. God even cares about little things.



Veronica, the co-founder of Mothers Prayers is coming to Australia and will be giving talks in Parishes in Cairns, Brisbane, Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth. Mothers Prayers is a movement of the Holy Spirit and has now spread to over 80 countries. Recently Veronica commissioned eight new coordinators for Russia.

Veronica is a down to earth mother and grandmother whom God has used to encourage people to pray for their children and surrender them to Jesus. She says God's in charge we are just His secretaries.

I believe that Mothers Prayers is a great evangelisation tool as it meets mothers at their point of need. People meet in small groups to pray and share their concerns in a confidential non judgemental environment.

SOE Parish Evangelisation Program—Mill Park

For some years, I used to help Fr Michael Shadbolt with the healing Mass and ministry each Sunday night at St. Kevin's Hampton Park. Many were healed and people flocked there for help. Fr Michael followed carefully our Lord's pattern of ministry. Our Lord preached the Good News and then healed people. Fr. Michael gave a powerful homily and during and after Mass there was healing prayer. All this was accompanied by anointed singing by fine choirs and groups. Continually we pondered, "Where do we go next?"

It was at the "Hearts on Fire" Congress at the Exhibition Buildings that I found what I was looking for. I saw the *Schools of Evangelisation* stand and spoke with Pat Kelly about the work of the Schools.

"This is where we go next," I thought, "this is what we are looking for." The Pope had called for a New Evangelisation, but more importantly, I sensed that the Holy Spirit was leading the church in this direction.

The healed people had to spread the Good News. How could they be helped to do this?

At the end of the year came a transfer to St. Francis of Assisi Parish, Mill Park, where Fr. Eugene Ahern had established "Cells of Evangelisation" – small groups of people reflecting on the gospel, sharing their lives and trying to

evangelise in their surroundings. These cells had been meeting for five years and were ready to go further on the path of evangelisation. So we decided that the Schools of Evangelisation were the ones to help us. We have had a series of information sessions with Gary Stephens and our first weekend retreat here at the parish. To the right are some pictures from some of the activities at the New Life weekend on 4th & 5th June 2005 where we had 50 participants.

Brilliant talks, punctuated by simple experiences and power point displays have made the message accessible to the simplest. We are going to continue on throughout the year with these weekend training days to form people in themselves and equip them with the skills to be evangelisers. There is no doubt a substantial group of trained people is needed to spread the Good News in Mill Park.

We hope to welcome more people into our small groups and cells, so that when they come to the Lord, they come to a community of faith as well.

I believe this is a work of the Lord and so it will certainly succeed. The Kingdom is coming and nothing can stop that. But we can be part of it or not. Here is a great way for parishioners to take the Good News to the world today.
